PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 10, 2017 /PRNewswire/ --To broaden accessibility to higher education in the Philadelphia region, <u>Peirce College</u> and <u>Harcum College</u> have partnered to bring affordable bachelor's degree programs to Harcum's campus.

Peirce will offer two bachelor's degree programs at Harcum's Bryn Mawr campus?Healthcare Administration and Integrated Leadership Studies?for Harcum graduates seeking to build on the foundation developed during their associate degree studies. Classes begin Jan. 17.

"Peirce and Harcum both have a rich history of fulfilling the needs of a diverse group of students with a wide range of goals," said Peirce College President & CEO James J. Mergiotti. "With this partnership, we have found a way to unify our missions to help more students continue their education, and gain the skills and credentials that will impact the economy of the region."

Those who enroll will be Peirce students and will receive a degree from Peirce upon the completion of the program, but enrollees may elect to become resident students in one of Harcum's two residence halls. They will also have the unprecedented benefit of access to student services and amenities from both institutions, including Peirce's program specific academic advisors and extensive career development services, as well as Harcum's library and full complement of student services.

"This is a value-add opportunity for Harcum graduates," said Jon Jay DeTemple, president of Harcum College. "Now our alumni can complete a bachelor's degree here, at the campus they know and among the friends and faculty they value."

Approximately 32 percent of Harcum students typically continue on for their bachelor's degree after graduating with their associate degree. The Peirce/Harcum partnership offers a seamless path for new Harcum graduates and a comfortable return to campus for less recent Harcum alumni. Students will be able to transfer up to 90 previously earned credits and receive up to \$3,000 in scholarships.

In recent months, Peirce has devoted significant resources to expand its mission of providing adult learners with convenient and affordable access to career-focused degrees. Peirce has introduced Peirce Fit across its entire curriculum, allowing students

to choose from week-to-week whether to attend class in-person or online. It also launched the only competency-based Information Technology program in Philadelphia, which awards college credit based on a student's ability to prove mastery of skills, not for hours spent in a classroom. Peirce recently introduced additional resources to strengthen its relationships with local employers, providing customized training resources, tuition discount programs and other innovative solutions to improve the skills of the region's workforce.

Harcum College has offered associate's degrees on its Bryn Mawr campus for decades. Now, graduates in certain fields will be able to go on for their bachelor's, too.

Peirce College, which offers both two-year and four-year degrees at its Philadelphia campus, will partner with Harcum to allow its graduates to go on for their bachelor's on Harcum's campus.

Under the new partnership, called "Peirce College at Harcum," Peirce will offer two degree programs at Harcum, one in health care administration and the other in integrated leadership studies.

Classes in both begin Jan. 17. Six students are enrolled, and applications are still being accepted, the colleges said in a joint press release. More programs could be added over time if the demand is there, Harcum spokeswoman Gale Martin said.

"Peirce and Harcum both have a rich history of fulfilling the needs of a diverse group of students with a wide range of goals," Peirce College President and CEO James J. Mergiotti said. "With this partnership, we have found a way to unify our missions to help more students continue their education..."

Founded in 1865, Peirce caters to working adults offering programs that allow students each week to choose whether to attend class in person or online. It offers bachelor's and associate programs in business, health care, information technology and legal studies, as well as master's in health care administration and organizational leadership and management.

Harcum, which was founded in 1915, offers associate's in nursing, the allied health professions, business and social sciences, as well as certificate programs. About 1,600 students take classes at its Bryn Mawr campus.

Students who enroll in the two new bachelor's programs at Harcum will be considered Peirce students and will receive a Peirce degree. They also will have the option of living in Harcum's residence halls and will have access to services, such as academic advising, from both colleges.

"This is a value-add opportunity for Harcum graduates," Harcum President Jon Jay DeTemple said. "Now our alumni can complete a bachelor's degree here, at the campus they know and among the friends and faculty they value." Students will be able to transfer up to 90 credits and receive up to \$3,000 in scholarships, the schools said. About a third of Harcum graduates pursue their bachelor's degree.

Peirce began recruiting Harcum graduates last semester, and Harcum notified its alumni in the region of the new programs.

**Title:** This Peirce College IT program lets you earn a bachelor's degree on your own time

Times are changing for technologists who don't have a bachelor's degree, and it's something **Samuel Rennix IV** has experienced firsthand.

A senior systems administrator for account provisioning at <u>Penn Medicine</u> who's worked in the tech industry for nearly 17 years, Rennix is now heading back to school. He's one of the many Penn employees who are working to get a bachelor's degree, after Penn made it a requirement for employees wanting to advance in the workplace.

For someone who has three kids and a wife, as well as a full-time job, Rennix needed an online degree program that fit into his life.

That's why Rennix enrolled in <u>Peirce College's</u> new <u>competency-based education (CBE)</u> <u>degree program</u>, where he spent this past fall finishing his first seven credits during the program's inaugural term. The CBE program is currently aimed toward individuals seeking an IT bachelor's degree with a concentration in networking, administration and information security. <u>We first reported on it last summer</u>.

So how does Peirce's program differ from other fully online degree programs? **Brian Finnegan**, director of the CBE program and dean of information technology at Peirce, describes it as a program for those who are disciplined and highly-motivated to earn their educational credential.

For a flat rate of \$3,000 per term, CBE students can complete as many "competencies," or skill sets, as they can over the 15-week semester, adding additional ones as they complete others, Finnegan said. Speaking of money, students don't need to buy a single textbook — all the required reading materials are made available for downloading online.

Because the program is self-paced, CBE students turn in assignments on deadlines that work for them and their schedule. But that doesn't give students an excuse to slack off — the assignments range from project-based case studies simulating the kind of work these students will be, or have already been, doing to industry certification exams that show employers what they're really able to do. Students must also complete these assignments at a B-level or higher to move on to their next assignment or competency.

And for those who struggle with finding the time to make that grade, don't worry: flexibility is a key facet for Peirce's CBE program. In fact, it was developed with the goal

of removing any artificial obstacles that present themselves to the program's prospective students, all of whom are working adults.

"Getting an 'F' on an assignment because there was a deadline and you were traveling for work is the sort of barrier that has nothing to do with actual skill development. It's obstacles like this that stand in the way of success for a lot of adult students," Finnegan said. "CBE eliminates that obstacle."

**Christa Donato**, the CBE coach for the IT degree program, is a cornerstone for students to stay on track. Think of her as a much more-involved college advisor — she meets with each student twice a month (on-campus, over the phone or even by email), sends out a weekly newsletter to make sure the students know what's going on as well as what's expected of them and creates blueprints uniquely designed for each student to help them throughout their terms.

Along with being a coach, Donato is a cheerleader for these students: providing the motivation they need to keep going and understanding each student's life situation and where they may face hidden obstacles. Whether its family issues, sick relatives to take care of or being a single parent, students can trust that Donato is there to work with them.

"It's all about molding them and helping understanding where they're coming from and helping them to adjust to college life again, or college life for the first time as adults," said Donato, who holds master's degrees in technology education and clinical mental health counseling.

"It can be a shock to students when they return. They have so many responsibilities, so I help them figure out how to balance it all."

The school believes a program like this — the first of its kind in Philadelphia, according to Peirce — are needed for adults who want to ultimately advance in the tech industry.

"There are many adults who have some college education, some formal training, but no degree, and programs like this are perfect for that constituency," Finnegan added. "That's a lot of human potential to be realized in Philadelphia and across the country. Programs like ours can make that happen."

If you think you're a good fit for the CBE IT bachelor's program, Donato encourages you to take the <u>CBE Assessment</u> to get started.

#### <u>Take it</u>

"There's not one set mold for a CBE student and that's what I think I love the most about being a CBE coach," Donato said. "I handle each student's case on an individual basis and give them the attention they need to be successful." As for Rennix, he's happy he can attend a program that allows him to balance school with his job — and maybe the occasional Netflix binge with his wife.
